Sheriff Phil Redmond has always believed that children are our most precious resource. That it is our responsibility as a society to offer our children opportunities and resources to help them grow and develop their talents and abilities. That is what this CD and tonight's program are all about.

By partnering with the Boys and Girls Club, Appropriate placement Options, ISS and the NC Governor's Crime Commission, the Iredell County Sheriff's Office wanted to expose the youth of Iredell County to alternatives to criminal gangs. Through a summer long program, more than three hundred young people took part in daily programs learning and experiencing the creative arts. Through these programs they had the opportunity to participate in music, art, drama, photography and other creative arts such as dance and poetry. They also participated in group sessions where they learned lessons in team building, sign language, self esteem and the dangers of drugs and criminal gangs.

Ranging in ages from 8 to 16, the performers tonight are not professionals. However, you will feel their sincerity and enthusiasm when you listen to their voices. But the most important thing to understand is, they have learned that with hard work and desire, they can achieve their dreams and goals. You will observe that each of them truly believe: I CAN FLY!
